This celebration comes up every third Sunday of the year in ordinary time. Here in Australia, it is celebrated this year on the 5<sup>th</sup> of Feb. From the very beginning, the Word of God is the source and the creating force which brought everything into being except man. From creation story, God spoke and things came into being; sky, earth, water and the creatures that swamp within them. And they came into being in these two formula; creation and separation. But on the sixth day God formed man in his own image and likeness. Whatever that word 'to form' meant is not the concern of this reflection, maybe it could form a topic of its own reflection some other time but certainly not this one.

Throughout human history the Word of God has been present and each time it's spoken it usually has a resulting effect. It could be to bring things into being or to take things out of being. That is the penetrating force and power of God's word. But now and again it is best described as light which has the creating power of illumination not limited only to our paths but to our minds also. In the book of Psalms 199: 105, David sang, 'your word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path', indicating once again that creating force and power of God's word that dispels every form of darkness. This darkness could mean the darkness of sin and death, the darkness of evil thoughts and schemes which could come in various forms and shapes like in ideological or political charades, sociological or psychological manipulations, emotional or intellectual prejudices. But over and above all of that, the word of God challenges us also in various ways.

Pope Francis who's currently on apostolic journey in the Democratic Republic of Congo reminded us once again in this year's Word of God Sunday that 'the word of God is for everyone. The Word calls everyone to conversion, the Word makes us heralds'. This is one of the ways the Word of God challenges us, it sends us forth away from our comfort on the journey of encounter where we encounter others, encounter God and also encounter ourselves.

So, as we celebrate this year's Word of God Sunday may we be challenged once again along these lines of Pope Francis' reflection to go out as heralds bearing the gospel of good tidings.



In line with the 4th reading of ordinary time, students in Religion classes have been learning about the Beatitudes. By studying the Beatitudes, students can learn about Jesus's teachings and values and how they can guide their own lives. By following the Beatitude "Blessed the are peacemakers, for they will be called children of God," students can learn to resolve conflicts and promote harmony in their relationships.
