Life in Mission like Christ

A life lived for a mission. We are all born with a mission. We celebrate and reflect the fifth Sunday in the ordinary time. In the gospel passage Jesus Christ went to Simon Peter's house and cured his mother-in-law. And afterword's He cured sick people who were brought to him, cast out demons, taught the Word of God to people and preached the Kingdom of God. It means that His total life was in mission to bring all the people closer to God and give salvation to them.

So for this Sunday, let us remember this always in our mind that we are born with a mission and our Christian mission is to sanctify our life and also to build up the attitude of life in mission. This leads us to living our life to the fullest. If you are finding your life burdensome as of this moment and we see it as our mission. Many times on a personal note from my life, I feel priesthood is difficult and burden. But I console myself by saying "You are a priest for others and not for yourself." It gives me a good feeling and I am happy about it.

Let us remind ourselves that we are all given the responsibility to carry on the mission and living my life in a way I am expected to live today is more important. Today I believe that fulfilling the mission of Christ makes our life meaningful. Jesus lived His life with mission and fulfilled it to the end. May we imitate the life and discipline of Jesus. The life lived with a mission and a life lived for mission is rewarding and blessing to ourselves and to our families.

Be a missionary by doing the will of God.
