PEACE BE WITH YOU

Dear friends in Jesus Christ, sometimes we find ourselves in a constant state of sadness and unhappy. We do feel that though we have everything in life, we question ourselves "why is it that I am still unhappy?" and so we begin to search for peace and happiness everywhere in life. We often tend to look for peace and happiness in the members of our family, or friends circle. But knowing fully well that the warmth of the peace and happiness that they give us last only while they are around us and when they are gone, we are back to the same situation namely a world of confusion and chaos. Sadly, we look to external sources in search of peace and happiness, not realizing that the real answer lies deep with ourselves. Yes, peace does lie within us.

In today's gospel, the Risen Lord appears to His disciples again with his first comforting salutation and greeting "Peace be with you," and asking them "Why are you troubled?" The same Risen Lord comforts each one of us today with His words, "Peace be with you." Even as he asks each one of us, "Why are you troubled?" we are troubled because we often focus on the things and events of this world and easily forget God's abiding presence in our midst. Sometimes, we need to change our focus and open our minds and hearts to God, just as the Risen Lord opens the minds and hearts of the disciples.

He makes them understand the plan of God, just like Peter in the first reading who helped the people to perceive God's will and plan for them, after they were troubled with what had taken place in their lives. In other words, all that we need to do is to take time and allow the intervention of the King of Peace. **Remember that there is someone greater that you and I.** He has the master plan and is in complete control. So, place everything- our hurts, worries, tensions, problems, fears, troubled life, negativity of mind and deeds in His hands and heart so that we will find rest in Him and His peace will remain in our hearts.

Only if we find peace within us, make peace with others, and are ever at peace with God. Peace within us: we read in Saint Paul's letter to Colossians, "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts." God wants His peace to rule in our lives. His guiding peace for the confused heart, His comforting peace for the broken hearted, His confidence-filled peace for the worried heart. Peace with others to strengthen our relationship with others. God offers us a forgiving peace. Peace with God: to set us at peace with Himself, God sent us the King of peace, His only begotten Son, who died for our sins on the Cross. He raised Him to new life to prove how powerful and generous to save all of us. The Risen Christ, the King of Peace salutes each one us today, saying "Peace be with you" Let us accept it, live it and share it with others. May God bless us with His peace in every walks of our life. Fr Krupa
