Placed before us this Sunday, is the compassion and generosity at the heart of God's salvific plan towards His people not only in the past but in our time and always. Our first reading and the gospel are similar in a sense that they both narrate the miracles of the multiplication of bread as an expression of that compassion. Compassion as mentioned in the gospel of last Sunday was what motivated Jesus to change his plans of rest in order to attend to the needs of the people who were like sheep without a shepherd.

In our first reading, Elisha noticed that the people were hungry and moved by compassion, he generously offered them food to eat. God, through Elisha miraculously multiplied the food, thus fulfilling his prophecy: "They will eat and have left over."

In the gospel, moved equally by compassion for his flock, Jesus, replicated the miracle of Elisha. He fed more than five thousand people with just five loaves of bread and two fish. This miracle shows his sensitivity to the situation and needs of his people. Compassion which is the basis of empathy and sympathy moved both Elisha and Jesus to care for the flock. We need compassion to understand what it means for others to be hungry, thirsty, sick, homeless, jobless, and lonely.

One of the outstanding lessons is that God can transform something little into something great. This is because our God is a God of possibilities and this is manifested in the generosity of the little boy who became a hero in Jesus' miracle. He generously offered what he had and that generosity became the motivation of a great miracle for his community. From two fish and five loves, the community was blessed with more baskets of food.

To be compassionate is to be like Christ. To be generous is to cooperate with Christ in his ministry. Christ sought the cooperation of his disciples and community, and the little boy cooperated with what he had. He exhibited a fraternal spirit and so, changed the destiny of his community.

How we respond to the needs of our community in times of need makes a lot of difference. The goods we have, our talents, time, knowledge, experience, including our faith are values that we must place at the service of others.

Through his generosity and compassion, Christ continues to work miracles in our midst. He continues to feed and nourish us physically and spiritually at every Eucharistic celebration. So, with the psalmist let us praise Christ: "You open wide your hand, O Lord, and grant our desires."

PRAYER FOR THE FIRST WORLD DAY FOR GRANDPARENTS AND THE ELDERLY


I thank You, Lord, for the comfort of Your presence: even in times of loneliness, you are my hope and my confidence, you have been my rock and my fortress since my youth!

Mission Ambassador Program

As a Christian community we are called to Mission. Not all of us, however, will go overseas on Mission. Through the Mission Ambassador Program, run my Catholic Mission Australia, students have the opportunity to put their faith into Action. Students act as Catholic Mission's voice and presence on World Mission Sunday (October 24) for the annual appeal at Masses held by the Living Waters Parish. This is the weekend when parishes prayerfully and financially support the missionary work of our universal church. Three of St Columban's students; Sofia Duthler, Gabi Moefaauo and Jessica Lonergan will advocate at Masses held by the Living Water Parish. Our student will use their voice to tell the story of the essential work of the Good Shepherds Sisters in Bangkok, Thailand, as they reach out to vulnerable mothers and their babies providing pre and post-natal care. However, the Home can only continue this work through the generosity of others. Through this appeal, parishioners are given the opportunity to come alongside the Sisters to ensure more mothers in needs are given an opportunity at a brighter future. It is also a way to depth a missionary awareness and understanding among our students through service learning in action.
