Fulfilling God's Promise

Christian living takes place 'between the times,' between the first coming of Christ and his second coming. The first coming was humble, to say the least: an infant born of poor parents in an obscure village. The second coming will be different: "The powers in the heavens will be shaken and people will be distraught at the roaring of the sea and the waves."

Both comings of Christ bring justice. Jeremiah says of the coming messiah that he will be "for David a just shoot; he shall do what is right and just in the land," and because of him Jerusalem shall be called "The Lord our justice." The second coming is also about justice, about God setting things right, about the ransoming of those who "can stand up straight and stand secure before the Son of Man."

Jesus came to us in Bethlehem to renew the world in love and justice. Christ will come again to fulfill God's promise of love and justice.

Love induces the Church to concern herself constantly about the true temporal welfare of men. Without ceasing to recall to her children that they have not here a lasting dwelling, she also urges them to ... promote justice, peace and brotherhood among men, to give their aid freely to their brothers, especially to the poorest and most unfortunate. The deep solicitude of the Church, the Spouse of Christ, for the needs of men, for their joys and hopes, their griefs and efforts, is therefore nothing other than her great desire to be present to them, in order to illuminate them with the light of Christ and to gather them all in Him, their only Savior.

At the beginning of the year, staff and students were challenged to give life to our 2021 mantra of 'Inspired in Community.' We were each called to inspire those around us, and Year 6 leader Reagan Pellowe has certainly been a source of inspiration to the St Peter's community due to his charity work.

This year, Reagan was recognised as the Moreton Bay 2021 Australia Day Young Citizen of the Year, collecting more than 200,000 bottles for recycling through the State Government's Containers with Change refund scheme, donating all of the money earned to helping children in need.

Reagan raised funds to support Easter hampers for the Morayfield Child Safety Service Centre, purchased back-to-school bags for The Breakfast Club, bought Christmas toys for children in foster care and donated boredom bags for children staying at the Redcliffe and Caboolture hospitals. He also collected over 3000 bottle lids for 'Lids 4 Kids' to be made into prosthetics for children.

Reagan is inspiring positive change in the community, and should be very proud of his achievements.

We have had another busy week at Columban's, this week we celebrated the Feast Day of St Columban. Here are just some of the fun facts that we shared with our students:

He was credited for several miraculous events which led to his canonisation which is the process whereby someone becomes a saint.

Here are just a few:

- Curing sick monks who then worked to reap a harvest
- Healing a blind man in Orleans
- Surviving a wolf pack with no injuries
- Multiplying bread and beer for his community and
- Taming a wild bear and yoking it to pull a plough.

It is quite clear that St Columban was not completely orthodox in his methods, but undeniably he had a fervent love for God. Columban was a man of courage who challenged society and church authorities alike; he was a scholar, a poet, a man with a deep sensitivity to nature. His integrity and deep sense of God attracted many people. He always tried to balance the demands of work, both in the community and with the local people, with time for withdrawal and quiet prayer. In this, he was following the example of Jesus himself. Columban left a legacy of many monasteries which taught and served the local people. He is probably the kind of leader we need right now; unafraid to challenge authorities and the leading with a sense of mission and moral purpose. Our wish for the students is that they are inspired by his legacy, filled with love of God and ready to lead with audacity and hope.

I hope that the season of Advent brings a sense of peace as we wait in anticipation and hope for the celebration of the coming of the Christ Child.
