The readings of this Sunday, the thirteenth in ordinary time, is tactically woven around the call, of who and the demand of discipleship. I use the adverb "tactically," because it is geared towards a single goal or purpose, which is answering the call that God constantly places on our shoulders.

Every Christian, it does not necessarily matter to which denomination one is aligned, all are called to be a follower of Christ, or as the earliest disciples were called, a "follower of the way". That is in fact what Christianity means- "a follower of Christ" meaning a disciple.

First and foremost, to be a disciple is a vocation- a calling which streams from God the initiator down to the recipient of the call. It can also pass-through mediums of communication, for example, the church (as an institution) or people (our parents, friend, colleague etc.). However, it is not a straightforward journey. It requires moments. Moments of discernment, acceptance (or not accepting) and then following (or not following). And there are factors that can either mitigate against it or reinforce one's commitment to it. In the first reading 1Kings 19: 16, 19-21, we see God extending the call to become a prophet to the son of Shaphat of Abel Meholah, Elisha through the instrumentality of Prophet Elijah. Of course, it was not easy. Elisha had to give excuses- "let me first kiss my mum and dad farewell" then I will come follow you. We also see that in the gospel of Luke 9:51 -62 with the two "wanna-be" disciples that approached Jesus as he took the road to Jerusalem.

The first 'nameless man' approached him and said; Sir I will follow you wherever you go. The shocking reply from Jesus must have influenced the man to turn away from his quest. We must not fail to ask here- why? Could it be that the man at first did not understand the details of what he was asking for? Like this nameless man, we at times fall short to grasp what our vocation as Christians in our ever-changing world entails. These can happen when our sinful pasts behoves us in our sincere struggle to be better human beings and committed Catholics, and we fail to see the new path which God is creating before us, or the sincere steps we have made to be better by God's grace coupled with our human efforts.

Or like this nameless man, we are swayed by the frenzy of our desires that we begin to clamour for positions of authority rather than the positions of service. It is something we all need to be careful of.


