At the Service of Peace

In today's Gospel, Jesus sends his disciples out in pairs, and he tells them to bring nothing with them. They are to carry the message that the kingdom of God is at hand, but they must trust in God's care.

For it is God whose "right hand is filled with justice," it is God who will "free us from sin," and it is God who will "spread prosperity over [the world] like a river, and the wealth of the nations like an overflowing torrent."

The disciples of Jesus are sent to call others to "come and see the works of God, his tremendous deeds among men."

They know that the Lord's power shall be "known to his servants through their efforts," and they exclaim with Paul: "May I never boast of anything but the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ!"

We Christians are called to go out into the world with a message of love, justice, forgiveness, and peace. We are to work for the coming of the kingdom. But our hope is in the Lord, and our faith tells us that the salvation of the world is a gift from God.

"Blessed is he who hopes in God."

Because peace, like the kingdom of God itself, is both a divine gift and a human work, the Church should continually pray for the gift and share in the work. We are called to be a Church at the service of peace, precisely because peace is one manifestation of God's word and work in our midst.

Introduction of an Acknowledgement of Country to our Masses

The National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC) was established by the Australian Catholic Bishops in 1992. It is the peak advisory body to the Catholic Bishops of Australia. NATSICC's Vision statement states that it "promotes and celebrates the cultural identity of our Peoples across the Nation by living and expressing in all its endeavours, the spirituality of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Peoples. Again, this year NATSICC has developed important resources for celebrating this Sunday as the Church in Australia celebrates Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander People Sunday. The Catholic Archdiocese of Brisbane has been developing a Reconciliation Action Plan over the last two years to be implemented across the Archdiocese; several parishes have already piloted the reconciliation plan. As our Archbishop remarks: "Under the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the implementation of this plan will lead communities on a new path of trust and respect. My ardent hope and prayer is that Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples will be encouraged, empowered and supported in every way, so that the entire People of God will be enriched by the gifts which they alone can bring." Archbishop Mark's desire reflects *Pope John Paul II's words to Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples in Alice Springs in 1986*: "Your culture, which shows the lasting genius and dignity of your race, must not be allowed to disappear. Do not think that your gifts are worth so little that you should no longer bother to maintain them. Share them with each other and teach them to your children. Your songs, your stories, your paintings, your dances, your languages, must never be lost." As part of our Parish's positive and supportive movement toward reconciliation with our First Nations peoples, and development of a Parish Reconciliation Action plan, our Parish Pastoral Council has endorsed the decision that from this Sunday we will introduce our weekend Masses with an Acknowledgement of Country.

As NATSICC explains: "An Acknowledgement of Country is a way that all people can show awareness and respect for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander culture and heritage and the ongoing relationship the Traditional Custodians have with their Country. ... It is a demonstration of respect dedicated to the Traditional Custodians of the lands (or sea) where the Mass, event, meeting, school function or conference takes place." This is not simply ticking a box. With the Acknowledgement of Country we will be taking the opportunity to show our respect for the country, the waters and its people. May God bless us all in our endeavours to be a people of reconciliation.
