Dear Parishioners,

We are living in a world where nobody is satisfied with what he or she is having. Everybody wants more and more that tells us the reality that whatever we accumulate cannot give us complete satisfaction in life. The term 'having' signifies all that we accumulate especially the worldly things that we think which may bring us happiness and satisfaction. Erich Fromm distinguishes between two modes of existence. One can live one's life in the mode of having or in the mode of being. The mode of having perceives everything as a possession, while in the mode of being we perceive ourselves as the carriers of properties and abilities, rather than the consumers of things. We have to eradicate the culture of having and give importance to the culture of being. It is a complete U-turn in our perception which enable us to widen the horizon of our knowledge and understanding of reality.

Jesus in this Sunday's gospel tells us do not trust too much on your worldly treasures which can be either stolen by thieves or easily destroyed by moths rather keep your treasures in heaven. He further added that where your treasure is, there will your heart be also. I think what Jesus meant here is nothing but getting rid of this having culture and do our level best to promote a culture of being. In order to achieve peace of mind and satisfaction in life we should look beyond our accumulating culture to sharing culture where we give priority to God and show respect and concern towards our fellow brethren.

Jesus is encouraging his followers that they have no need to be filled with worry or anxiety about how they will be provided for. The way we handle material goods determines whether we have earthly treasures or treasures in heaven. The Gospel is consistent in teaching us that true security is to be found not in wealth or possessions but in the providence of God. Jesus tells us today to be ready and to be prepared when the Master comes. For all our care and precautions, there is absolutely no way we can know when or how the Master will come to call us to himself. Jesus is warning us today about something much more important than the property we own, namely, the quality of our lives.

Jesus concludes His teaching by saying, "From everyone to whom much has been given, much will be required; and from the one to whom much has been entrusted, even more, will be demanded." In other words, we have to be accountable for our deeds. To retain satisfaction in life Jesus makes three demands of his followers. First, give priority to God in your life. Second, share with the needy. Third, be vigilant and prepared. We have to have our lamps lit and keep them burning so that it shows light to all.
