CLERGY CONVOCATION

This coming Tuesday and Wednesday (16/17th August), all the clergy of the Archdiocese (Bishops, Priests and Deacons) are gathering for the annual Clergy Convocation. Postponed from earlier in the year, it's great that we will be able to gather together. Leading up to our gathering clergy have taken time over the last couple of months, both individually and in Deanery meetings, to discern questions focused on personal ongoing formation, and Parish Sustainability. The questions for personal formation are orientated to the areas of human, spiritual, intellectual, and pastoral/professional formation. The framework for looking at parish sustainability to guide discernment is taken from Pope Francis' "The Joy of the Gospel." For example, the Pope's vision articulated in part in these words: "The parish is not an outdated institution; precisely because it possesses great flexibility, it can assume quite different contours depending on the openness and missionary creativity of the pastor and the community. While certainly not the only institution which evangelizes, if the parish proves capable of self-renewal and constant adaptivity, it continues to be 'the Church living in the midst of the homes of her sons and daughters.'" Submissions from these discernments will form the basis for further discernment at the Convocation and beyond, as the Archdiocese continues to seek ways to guide its missionary impulse. Please pray that the Holy Spirit guides us in these days.
