***Driving into Caboolture from the M1 via exit 152A have you ever paid attention to your left, just shortly as you merge, where there is a sign with the inscription that reads "welcome to Caboolture where life styles matter". Now the question would be, which lifestyle?***

***Today, we celebrate social justice Sunday. Social justice is political and philosophical theory that focuses on the concept of fairness in relations between individuals in a society and equal access to wealth, opportunities and social privileges in that society. Over the years, this concept has developed from theories into actions. The social justice statement for this year's celebration from the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference reads; confronting violence and abuse. Therein, the bishops join their voice to the global campaigns to confront and call out destructive attitudes and behaviours that lead to life-limiting and long-lasting impacts on many vulnerable members of our families, churches and society.***

***In a world that has been shattered once again by timid ideologies of superiority through war and violence even as we cripple with the effects of COVID19, the bishops couldn't have put it any better: "the voices of victims and survivors of violence and abuse are woven together with scripture, social research, and our rich Catholic social justice teachings. This theological reflection also invites us to contemplate the ways in which themes within our Christian tradition can be misused to justify, legitimize, or normalize violence, such as forgiveness, submission and leadership.***

***In the opening statement of the first reading from the book of Ecclesiasticus (AKA Sirach), it calls us "my child"... and goes on to advise us on the virtue of humility- humility before God and humility before one another. Often times we play around with the word humility without necessarily paying attention to what it entails. To be humble doesn't necessarily mean to be agreeable. Rather it means freedom from pride or arrogance as the Oxford dictionary has it. It is a quality where one considers the welfare/good of others first before himself. Modesty is the closest virtue to it. It stands on two poles; humility both in words and in action. And it is practise able; having a listening ear for others, mindfulness, being grateful for what you have, being able to ask for help when you need one, seeking sincere feedbacks, and reviewing your actions against the language of pride.***

### Classroom Teaching of Religion
