From my little chat with some parishioners, it does appear that the readings are beginning to take rather a very disturbing tone. Well, this has been the case given that by this time of the year, the liturgical calendar for example 2022, starts winding down gradually, and even the civil calendar is winding down too, so our readings mostly will be focused on the last three things; death, judgement and reward (by reward I mean life after death). All these put together are called eschatology which is, in a loose sense, that part of theology which is concerned with death, judgement and the final destiny of souls (of humankind).

The readings for this Sunday take the same tone where we hear the prophecy of Malachi in the first reading speaking of Yahweh's recompense, "the day of the Lord which shall come like a refiners furnace to burn away the arrogant and evil doers and the sun of righteousness shining on the just." These are prophetic words which of course require careful readings and interpretations less they lose their desired import. We can find one of such desired imports in Jesus' answer to the question 'when and what' in the Gospel. To reiterate, Jesus says: "take care not to be deceived because many will come using my name to say all sorts of things to you. And when you hear of wars and revolutions, do not be frightened, for this is something that must happen but the end is not so soon..."

So the key word here is "take care" which loosely mean in English be cautious, keep yourself safe from deception, danger, harm, sin etc. One of the recurring advises that I have got from friends since I got my Aussie licence is "keep safe". Each time I hear that, what quickly comes to my mind is 'keep the rules' and to do that I do not only need to be careful whilst driving but also to be disciplined and always to make the right judgements. At least, all of these can to some degree bring safety while driving.

Bringing these drive-safety tips within the context of these readings for example, would help in some way for some clearer understanding. First, it tells us in clear terms something about the cogency of time. Like the book of Ecclesiastes 3: 1 would say, "for everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted..." meaning that our time here on earth is precious, should be enjoyed, and should be spent well.

It also tells us something about our life and the way we live it because, like a late friend of mine once told me, "Every action, every decision, every choice you make, every inaction or negligence has its cost and effect. If it is not affecting, you directly then there is someone somewhere it does affect. However, that should not be a cause for you to fear if only you are doing the right thing and helping others do same".

It also tells us something about ourselves and about the world that we live in, that we and the world we live in is not yet a perfect one. At least the man/woman in the mirror says it all. Maybe, that is where the first work should begin.
