Safeguarding Coordinator Sharron Macrae admin.livingwaters@bne.catholic.net.au This third Sunday we celebrate the joy of anticipation popularly called *Gaudete* Sunday which breaks away from the usual tone of advent celebration to talk about joy. Looking particularly on the Gospel Matthew 11: 2-11, one would wonder what's the joy all about given that the forerunner John the Baptist who was introduced in the whole scene just last Sunday is now under lock and key in prison and is also explicitly expressing some concern about the man of whom he spoke of last Sunday that will "baptise people with the Holy Spirit and fire, whose sandals he's unfit to untie".

Apparently, John's concern has thrown up a puzzle that needs solving and the reply of Jesus to his emissary isn't helping either. "go back and tell John, Jesus says, what you hear and see; the blind see again, and the lame walk, leapers are cleansed, and the deaf hear, and the dead are raised to life and the Good News is proclaimed to the poor; and happy is the man who does not lose faith in me". The question is, does it mean by any chance that John was losing faith in Jesus, the very man he foreruns?

The oracle of Isaiah 55: 8-9 declares, "for my thoughts are not your thoughts, neither are your ways my ways, says the Lord. As the heavens are higher than the earth, so are my ways higher than your ways and my thoughts than your thoughts". Those prophetic words from Isaiah can help in our attempt to solve that puzzle. Like John, there are times when we do not clearly understand what God says to us or in the various ways he calls us yet we feel and hear him calling, and he never stops in calling us into his mission. I dare to call it "the Baptist episode" and I do not mean that as a psychological event but literally as a group of events which occurs as a part of a sequence of events which should not be considered in isolation, of which may not follow any given order. So yes, there are times when we may even doubt about the elementary things we know and heard about God because they do not follow any particular order just like Mary in her annunciation narrative. She said to the Angel of Annunciation, 'but how can this come about...?'

But one thing stands out in both narrative. Even in their doubt, John the baptizer and Mary did not fail to ask question. John's was, "are you the Christ or should we expect another?" So, even in our doubts we must not fail to ask questions. Maybe, the joy of this Sunday's celebration that did interrupt the usual tone of advent flow could be one that asks questions.

Happy Gaudete Sunday and peace be with you!

Our country's Catholic bishops are encouraging us to respond to the call from the head of the Ukrainian Catholic Church in Australia to provide financial support to people in the war-torn nation as winter arrives. Bishop Mykola Bychok CSsR gave an update on the situation in Ukraine during the plenary meeting of the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference earlier this month. He thanked the bishops for praying - and inviting their communities to pray - for Ukraine and asked them to renew those prayers. He also requested that bishops hold a special collection to "support the people in Ukraine during this winter, which will be the most challenging for our country for decades of independence". The bishops gave strong support to that proposal, and are encouraging dioceses, eparchies, parishes, schools and other ministries to facilitate a special collection during Advent for Ukraine. "Mindful of the busyness of this pre-Christmas period, communities are invited to find a day, a weekend or some other moment or moments to focus on the people of Ukraine," said Bishops Conference president Archbishop Timothy. It should also be a time to again place the Prayer for Peace in Ukraine that the Bishops Conference composed back in February into our hearts and minds. (This prayer can be found on the back of the newsletter)

Our Parish will be taking up a special collection across all masses next weekend (after the Gospel but before the Homily) we ask that, if possible, you come prepared. We know that the financial demands on you during this time are extreme and there are constant calls for help from a variety of organisations, some of whom we know you support faithfully, but if you can look towards sparing a single gold coin to put towards this urgent call for help, assistance (through the above agency) can & will be given to those who face Winter in war-torn Ukraine. May God bless you in your compassion for our Ukrainian brothers & sisters. Fr David


Thank you in anticipation.
