It is for Him and in Him that we all have received the grace of now being called sons and daughters of God for so indeed we are. And as sons and daughters then we must continue to bear him witness.

We are already into more than half of the first of month of the New Year; we all expect it to be a good one for us all and our families and friends. We pray particularly for our brothers and sisters still suffering the distress of flooding here in Australia, for those of them in Ukraine and any other part of the world under the violence of war or religious persecution that this year brings them peace and joy. And for our children in their last few days of Christmas holidays, that they come back this week with renewed vigour.
