Archbishop Mark's Priority: Implementing Integral Ecology

Introduction: Consider for a moment the following question: why does the Church exist? We might rephrase the question and ask, what is the Church's mission? On this Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord, the Gospel reading provides us with an answer. Before ascending into heaven, Jesus says, "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all the nations." What is the Church's mission? To make disciples of Jesus. Pope Francis writes that "in all its activities the parish encourages and trains its members to be evangelizers" (EG 28).

Archbishop Mark writes: Natural and human ecology interact in mysterious and unmistakable ways. To interfere with one is to interfere with the other; to promote the good of one is to promote the good of the other. Fratelli Tutti (a recent Papal Encyclical) focuses more upon human ecology in speaking of the radical interconnectedness of all human beings at a moment when alienation and polarisation are making disconnectedness seem the norm. The Church is called in such a moment to be a sign of contradiction, speaking in a way that rises above politics and economics so that a genuinely biblical and Christian voice can be heard.

What is a Disciple? The first reading this weekend provide us insights into what it means to be a disciple. We see that the disciples had a personal relationship with Jesus. They didn't just know him, they also followed him, and allowed him to transform their lives. This is a challenge to all of us. Do we have a personal relationship with Jesus? Do we follow Jesus? Do we allow Jesus to transform our lives? The second reading provides further insight into the work of the Spirit which enables us to see God, ourselves and the earth with a new vision. With hearts enlightened by the Spirit we are able to see the immeasurable greatness of God, the wonder and dignity of every person as being made in the image of God, and the beauty and majesty of the earth which shouts of the glory of God. It is the encounter with Jesus that inspires the love of God, each other and creation.

Conclusion: Today our Lord calls each of us to go on mission but let us first consider our own journey as a disciple of Jesus. Have we personally encountered Jesus, and have we allowed Jesus the freedom to move in our hearts and transform our lives? Are we walking in the grace of our baptism and the empowerment of the Spirit received in confirmation? Let us first ask Jesus to again lead us, guide us, and help us on our journey as his disciple. In light of implementing an integral ecology, let us pray that as we help others encounter Jesus, that the Spirit would enlighten hearts to see the interconnectedness of all of creation in order that a conversion to Christ leads also to an ecological conversion that transforms hearts and minds toward a greater love of God, each other and creation.

Safeguarding and Key Access to Parish Properties

We have recently undergone our Safeguarding Audit by the Archdiocese. We received a mark of 79%. While good, we need to make some changes for improvement to this grade. One particular area is in regard to those who have key access to Parish properties. It is a requirement under the Archdiocesan Safeguarding Policy that all those who have key access must have a current Police Check. Hence the recent call to all those who have keys to parish properties to make yourself known to the Parish. Further to this call, we will be instigating a new key system across the parish. Present keys will become redundant, and new keys will be issued to those who require access to our parish properties. So, again, if you have key access to any of our parish properties, could you please make this known to the parish office. This will facilitate an ease of transition for those who have key access to our properties. - Safeguarding children, our vulnerable adults, and, in fact, all, is a non-negotiable for the Church and our parish. 
