What a time to say that prayer with one accord in a world filled with so many uncertainties and challenges. In a world still finding its feet with the realities of so many 'new normal'. While we continue to pray that the world finds its feet there's no need to despair, or maybe despair creeps in because we have not be looking at the right places for solutions. What if, maybe what we should be doing is to find ways to live with the realities of these 'new normal', like SARS COvid-19 is never going to go away anytime soon and so should be treated like any other virus out there that the world has been living with and just try and maintain any of the protocols of safety and care? Well, that's just a question anyways.

In all of these the prophecy of Joel 3:1-5, one of the Old Testament readings for the vigil mass gave us a prophetic promise; "I will pour out my spirit on all mankind..." and the attending gifts it assured us should encourage us to forge ahead with much desired enthusiasm even in difficult moments. But more to that it also wakes us up to the reality of the Pentecost events happening around us beginning from the spot where you're standing or seated reading this reflection. Just take a deep breath and take a look around you at the people that have gathered to worship. What do you see? Old friends who have been here for ages with you? If yes, then take a look again. If still same faces then ask yourself what has brought you and your friends together under one roof at this point in time. But if the people you see are new faces, people from different tongues and cultures; Filipinos, Indians, people from Africa, America, Europe, East Timorese, from the Islands of Samoa, Fiji, Pau-Pau New Guinee, Kiwis, people from the first Nations, wherever any one of us came from either first or fourth generation, what more can best describe this moment of coming together to pray if not Pentecost?

Yes! It is happening on the Island, inland, woods and on the mountain top. That's the beauty of who we are and the gifts that we share together. That's exactly what happened in the first reading when the Pentecost day came around. That was exactly the experience of the apostles and the people who gathered on that faithful day, each hearing each other preaching the marvels of God because we all carry within us these marvels. That's the beauty of today's celebration: that each of us have been called young and old, big and small to preach these marvels because we have them within us.
