It could be a gift card with precious words written on them, food voucher cards, birthday anniversaries or congratulatory cards. In moments of ill health, we also gift cards with words like 'get well soon', 'have you in my thoughts' etc. and all sorts. What that tells the recipient is that 'the sender cares about him/her or is part of her/his story at the moment. And from the sender, what she/he is saying with the card is 'I'm with you and care about you'.

Today we celebrate Christ's lasting gift to his disciples, the very gift of his body and blood, the sacrament of his ever-abiding and real presence to the church-the Eucharist. As defined; it is the sacrament of Christ's truly, real, soul and divinity in the form bread and wine. Meaning that in the very sacrament of the holy Eucharist the perishable bread (fruit of the earth and work of human hands) and wine (fruit of the vine and work of human hands) become the real and truly body and blood of Jesus Christ. The reality of this mystery only takes place within the celebration of the mass.

So, each time we celebrate the mass we call to mind this precious gift of Christ, his passion and death, his resurrection and his coming again in glory as we use to pray in 'the mystery of faith' – when we eat this bread and drink this cup, we proclaim your death Lord, until you come again. And we also call to mind our common priesthood in Christ and the need for us to become what we share.

In a world as changing as ours, in a church as multicultural as ours, in a country as diverse as ours and of course filled with diverse challenges, is it still possible for us Catholics to actually become what we share? In the recent gathering of Anglicans-Roman Catholic clergy day in the archdiocese themed: 'The Voice: What's It All About?' one of the interesting insights as well as challenges raised by Aunty Prof. Anne Pattel-Gray was on Christian understanding of redemption. She puts it; thus, 'in connecting our stories with that of the First Nations People we suddenly realise that none of us can be redeemed alone. My redemption is tied to your redemption. I cannot be redeemed without you and you cannot be redeemed without me'.

Today we recall just as in every mass Christ's precious gift to us- the sacrament of his body and blood which led to his precious sacrifice on the cross for the redemption of all who believe. Not just for the believers of yesterday and today alone but also for those who will come to believe in the future. As St. Paul puts it in the second reading; 'though there are many of us, we form a single body because we all have a share in this one loaf' (Cor. 10: 17).



On Thursday, a group of 20 students, accompanied by two staff members, embarked on a journey to Brisbane to participate in the highly anticipated event organised by the Brisbane Catholic Education called PoTENtial. This extraordinary gathering aimed to empower Year 10 students and help them recognise that they possess the ability to effect positive change within our community, without the need for a formal leadership role or external validation.

PoTENtial challenged the conventional belief that only those with innate leadership qualities or active involvement in their school or parish can make a difference. Instead, the program encouraged students who were to step outside their comfort zones and embrace a day of excitement, faith, connection, empowerment, encounter, and joy. Irrespective of their prior experiences or characteristics, PoTENtial provided an inclusive platform for these students to explore their untapped potential. By creating an environment that fostered personal growth, the event aimed to inspire the participants to discover their own unique capabilities and instil in them the confidence to make a positive impact on their communities.

There was lots of positive feedback from the staff and students who attended, claiming to have marked the beginning of a transformative experience that will equip the them with the necessary tools to realise their potential and become catalysts for change. Blessings Ange.

THE DIFFERENT WAYS OF FINANCIALY SUPPORTING OUR PARISH

You may have noticed we now have EFTPOS machines at the entrances to our Little Flower and St Peter's churches. These machines provide a quick and easy way of donating to the Parish using your cards. The Donate App downloaded on to the machine simply requires you to select the amount you wish to donate and to tap your card. Some of our parishioners will be available to help if needed. This system does not replace our other methods of giving. It is simply an added extra. Our other methods of giving include:

Envelopes: A set of 52 envelopes for both First and Second Collection are provided in September each year. The Envelopes are numbered, and your giving is recorded against your number. We ask that you mark the amount of giving on the front of the envelope in the space provided. This helps our counting teams with their weekly task.

Direct Debit from your Bank Account: You can choose to give to both/either First or Second Collections using this method. The amount/s you nominate can be debited from your account either fortnightly or monthly. A Direct Debit Request Form needs to be filled out and forwarded to ADF. Each contributor is given a number and amounts are recorded against this number. **Recurrent Payment using Credit Card:** This method is also available for First and Second Collections.

It is manually processed at the end of each month through the Commonwealth Bank. Using this method requires you to complete a new form each time you are issued with a new card. Each contributor is given a number and amounts are recorded against this number.

Electronic Transfer to a Parish Bank Account: Using internet banking parishioners transfer money directly to the Parish Bank Account either weekly/monthly/quarterly/annually or at your discretion.

An email is requested when you start this process to let the office know how you would like your giving distributed. Each giver is provided with a number and all contributions are recorded against that number.

Parish Giving App: An App which is downloaded from your App Store to your mobile phone. Select your Parish and create a one-off gift or set up a recurring gift using one of your cards. Our givers using this app can contact office if they require their gift to be recorded.

Cash on the collection plate is also very welcome.

I am available at the office on Tuesday and Wednesday each week.
