#### Christmas Gratitude

For there is a child born for us, a son given to us and dominion is laid on his shoulders; and this is the name they give him: Wonder-Counsellor, Mighty-God, Eternal-Father, Prince of Peace. Isaiah 9.

The powerful, energetic and encouraging words of the prophet Isaiah surround us in these days with an atmosphere of joy, as we come to celebrate the gift given to us of the One who is one-of-us, and the One who is one-withus! However, maybe occasionally this is a good thing. Our time of preparation and expectation gives way almost instantly to the moment of Jesus' birth and the wonder-full joy this God-given gift is. And in this way, and maybe particularly this year, this immediacy of squashy contact seems to reflect how our year has played out! It all seems to have come and gone all too quickly! Or maybe that's just me pondering how seemingly quickly the end of one phase of life has squashed up against the next phase for me.

Nevertheless, it is amid this celebration of life given to all of us in Jesus that I give thanks and am so very grateful for the gift you have been and remain for me: you, the people, the parish of Living Waters are simply and profoundly that Life-for-me, the Body of Christ!

May the God of love and life fill you all-ways with God's peaceful blessings.
