Today on the third Sunday of the ordinary season the Church celebrates **Sunday of the Word of God**. Pope Francis intended this initiative to set aside moments to reflect on the great importance of the Word of God for everyday living. **The Word of God is**:

*Spiritual Weapon

Which can fight against devil's snares and overcome his temptations.

*Guiding Map

Which informs to do good and avoid evil thus shows the path which leads to Heaven.

*Living Fountain

Which has springs of Eternal wisdom which provides spiritual comfort.

*Divine Novel

Which contains salvation history of God's infinite love towards humanity.

*Sacred Treasure

Because it contains the Holy Words of Holy God which enriches our spiritual life.

"Woe to me, If I do not preach the Gospel".

The Call of the first four group of fishermen by Jesus: -

Job:-Discipleship Company:-Kingdom of God

Interviewer:-Jesus Candidates:-Peter, Andrew, James, John

All the 4 were fisher men. Hence when Jesus called them, they were busy with their NETS. Peter and Andrew were casting their nets while James and John were mending their nets.

Today the same Lord needs true disciples [not merely Christians with titles but genuine followers]. He passes by us, as He passed by the Sea of Galilee. Perhaps the difference would be the disciples in the gospel were busy with their NETS, while we are busy with our INTER NETS.

The Gospel says they immediately left their NETS and followed Jesus. Like disciples we may not be able to totally leave aside our [INTER] NETS but all of us are called to spend time with the Lord and in doing good works, more than what we spend on internets.

From "Fishermen" to "Fisher of men" not just an Exchange but a Change. "Social profession" was changed into "Religious vocation". "Men of Galilee" now became "Men for Galilee". Experts of Sea" were now chosen an "Apostles of land". "Boats and nets" they left to take up "words and actions" of Christ. "Their father on earth they left to know 'Jesus' Father" in heaven. "Home's family" they left to form a "Disciple's family".

All this happened with the words of Jesus "Follow me". Great things happen when God intervenes in our life. Following Christ, not only makes our Life Meaningful but also Beautiful.

Each month, Pope Francis puts forward a prayer intention and asks Catholics around the world to join him in prayer. These monthly prayer intentions reflect the concerns of the Holy Father for the humanity and the sacred mission of the Catholic Church. For the month of January, we invite you to join us in prayer for the gift of diversity in the Church.

The Oxford Dictionary defines Diversity as 'the practice or quality of including or involving people from a range of different social and ethnic backgrounds and of different genders, sexual <u>orientations</u>, etc. '

Pope Francis says: "Only the Spirit can awaken diversity while at the same time building unity," "When we are the ones who try to create diversity and close ourselves up in what makes us different and unique, we bring division."

On the other hand, he said, "when we are the ones who want to build unity in accordance with our human plans, we end up creating uniformity, standardization."

The pope said the Holy Spirit can appear "to create disorder in the church" by bringing such different gifts to its members, but when everyone allows themselves to be guided by the Spirit, they learn to treasure variety rather than letting it become a source of conflict.

The Holy Spirit can make people uncomfortable, Pope Francis said. "Newness always makes us a bit fearful, because we feel more secure if we are the ones who build, program and plan our lives in accordance with our own ideas, our own comfort, our own preferences."

The spiritual journey is no different, he said. "We fear that God may force us to strike out on new paths and leave behind all our too narrow, closed and selfish horizons in order to become open to his own."

Seeking the newness God's offers through the Holy Spirit "is not a question of novelty for novelty's sake, the search for something new to relieve our boredom, as is so often the case in our own day," he said. "The newness which God brings into our life is something that actually brings fulfillment, that gives true joy, true serenity, because God loves us and desires only our good."
