Incredible Love of God

We are in the fourth Sunday of Lent. The readings of today make us aware that we are still sinful humans, called to grow in faithfulness and love. The first reading is from the second book of Chronicles and give us the sad history that God's people were unfaithful and finally taken from their land into exile in Babylonia. The story does not end there, however. Instead, this story gives us cause for joy because God brings some of His people back to Judah, to Jerusalem to rebuild the temple. The readings gives us message to all of us that we are people find it difficult to remain faithful. When we are unfaithful, God allows us to suffer the consequences and then, at least a remnant will return to the Lord.

The second reading is from the Letter to the Ephesians and speaks again about our failings and God's mercy. God, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ. It is the greatest gift of God.

Today's gospel reading make us aware of God's immense love and the priceless gift he gave us in His Son, Jesus. Jesus says that He will be raised, exactly as Moses raised the serpent in the desert. This potent image explains to us how Jesus death on the cross frees us from sin, just as the bronze serpent healed those who gazed upon it with faith.

God's immense love for us is the reason Jesus entered the world. He desired to demonstrate to us how to live with him forever. He desires for us to follow His instructions, have faith in Him, and believe in Him. We make the decision to live in the light of God's love when we decide to follow and believe in Jesus. This implies that, as Jesus taught us, we make an effort to treat people kindly, to forgive those who have wronged us and to assist those in need.

Following Jesus transforms us into the light of the world. He is light. We have the ability to spread God's love to others and provide people around us with the light of happiness and hope. It is essential to keep in mind that God still loves us despite our mistakes. When we sincerely repent from our sins and make an effort to return to the Lord, he is always willing to forgive us. Let us give thanks to God for sending Jesus to save us from His love. Let us pray for the ability to follow Jesus every day and to show His love to everyone we come into contact with.

To the People of God, Living Waters Parish

I have been approached by a member of the parish to seek the possibility that Fr Krupa and myself may be able to provide a Mass on Holy Thursday at each of the Churches.

I had advised the enquirer, that each mass takes somewhere in the vicinity of an hour and a half and it is not physically possible for the two of us to provide that many Masses and maintain some sense of our own health and well-being.

As you may see from the Holy Week schedule that was included in last weeks' newsletter, Fr Krupa and I have endeavoured to provide a shared access to the various Liturgies across the Triduum of Holy Week.

The intention being that what takes place this year will be reversed in the following year, so that each Community has some access to the various Liturgies of the Triduum.

Ideally, it would be good if we could provide everyone with each of the Liturgies, but the reality of our world today is that the priests available can only do so much and still maintain their own sense of health.

I do hope that you can understand that Fr Krupa and I will endeavour to do as much as we are able to provide the liturgies needed across the parish where we can all gather and celebrate the significant events of the Holy Week Triduum.

Until more priests arrive to serve the needs of parishes across our Archdiocese, the current situation is what we have and it is important for us to do all that we can to gather as Church in this current climate, with the resources that we have at our disposal.
